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Elmira City School District Brings Rachel's Challenge Story to Elmira Community, May 17

ELMIRA, NY, April 30, 2018 –The Elmira City School District is pleased to announce that on May 17, Rachel's Challenge will come back to Elmira for a second time this year. On May 17, the public is invited to this free presentation from 6 p.m. – 7 p.m. at the Ernie Davis Academy auditorium (933 Hoffman Street). Rachel's Challenge is a national nonprofit dedicated to making schools after, more connected places where bullying and isolation are replaced with kindness and respect; where learning and teaching are awakened to their fullest. Based on the life and writing of Rachel Joy Scott, the first victim of the Columbine tragedy of 1999, Rachel's Challenge provides a continuous improvement process designed to awaken the learner in every child. The objective is to motivate and equip students and staff to start and sustain a chain reaction of kindness and compassion that transforms schools and communities. The May 17 special community presentation is being provided as an opportunity to experience what students experienced during the day and for the community at-large to embrace the profound message that this program delivers. This program is free and open to the public and is appropriate for ages 12+. The Friends of Rachel club of Elmira High School will offer free childcare during the presentation, free of charge.

Elmira High School students first had the opportunity to hear the Rachel's Challenge program in March during a one-hour assembly. This first program was the beginning of a series, with grades 7-9 to also have the opportunity on May 17 and May 18 during the school day.

This program is made possible through an Empire State After-School Program grant.

Rachel's Challenge exists to equip and inspire individuals to replace acts of violence, bullying, and negativity with acts of respect, kindness, and compassion. Rachel's Challenge is based on the life and writings of Rachel Joy Scott who was the first victim of the Columbine school shootings in 1999. Through her example, Rachel's Challenge is making a positive impact in the lives of millions of people every year.

Superintendents, principals, teachers, parents, and students bring Rachel's Challenge into their schools because of escalating problems such as: bullying, student isolation, teen suicide, discrimination, school violence, and increased disciplinary actions. Through powerful presentations,

trainings, community events, and professional development, Rachel's Challenge provides the sustainable solution. Rachel's inspiring story provides a simple, yet powerful example of how small acts of kindness and acceptance motivate us to consider our relationships with the people we come in contact with every day.

Rachel's Challenge renews our hope that our life has meaning and purpose. Rachel's story gives us permission to start our own chain reaction of kindness and compassion, which positively affects the climate in our schools and communities.

HISTORY OF RACHEL'S CHALLENGE

A few weeks after the tragedy, Darrell Scott, Rachel's father, spoke to a Congressional House Judiciary Committee regarding issues of school violence. His speech has become one of the most widely read document on the internet. Shortly afterwards, he founded "Rachel's Challenge", a bullying and violence abatement program. More than two million students annually experience Rachel's Challenge and have the opportunity to accept the challenges, modeled after Rachel's life and writings.

Students in the United States and several other countries have heard the universal message of kindness and compassion through Rachel's story. Since inception, over 23 million people have heard Rachel's story in live settings around the world, at least eight school shootings have been prevented, and over 500 suicides have been averted.

The Scott family and other Rachel's Challenge certified presenters have reached millions more on popular media outlets like CNN, Fox News, The Today Show, Good Morning America, Larry King Live, Oprah, Dateline, O'Reilly Factor, Hannity and Colmes and numerous others. Mr. Scott has also authored three books, including the bestseller "Rachel's Tears." Darrell meets regularly with politicians and educators, and is also a keynote speaker at many large educational venues. He met with President Bill Clinton on two occasions and President George W. Bush has written a personal letter recommending Rachel's Challenge.
